## **RINGING AT GREENHAM COMMON 2011**

#### Greenham Common: 2011 Ringing Report

2011 is the first full year of ringing at Greenham Common by Newbury Ringing Group and Greenham Common Nest Recording Group. The area operated is normally the common land in the parish of Greenham. Ringing by the group also takes place on Crookham Common usually by group member Pat Martin and is not covered by this document except for ground nesters at Crookham Pools Ringing was carried out at the following places:

Ranger's Compound (616) Control Tower Car Park. Here a feeding station is situated off the common in the fenced compound around the West Berkshire Rangers building known as 616. The feeder is referred to as the 616 feeder. It consists of a peanut feeder, a large black sunflower feeder, a fat-ball feeder and one to four Niger feeders depending on the intensity of use. Feeders are topped up every third day at least in winter less often at other times of the year. The basic mist net setup is one each of the following length nets: 18m, 12m, and 10m. These 2.7m high nets are erected in permanent rides near the feeders. Other nets are erected in the paddocks and around depending on the time of year, weather conditions and number of ringers attending a session. In the period October through to March the 616 feeder is ringed for four hours maximum at least once in each half of each month.

- Fire Plane Gravel Scrub East (FPGE). An area of birch and bramble scrub east of the fire plane near the Venture West building. Usually two nets are erected supplemented with additional nets depending on the number of ringers attending. This area is mostly utilised during spring and autumn migration but occasionally at other times.
- Fire Plane Gravel West (FPGW). An area of gorse scrub with some birch trees to the south west of the gravel. Usually three nets are erected more if other ringers are available.
- **Peaked Hill Nest Boxes (PHILL).** Thirty two nest boxes erected in the woodland to the south and west of the Fire Pane Gravel have been monitored since 2002 for the period April to July as part of the BTO Nest Box Scheme. All pulli found in the boxes are ringed each year.
- **Peckmore Copse & Sandleford Copse.** 34 boxes are erected; these areas of woodland are in the South west corner of the common. Each copse is monitored by a team of three or four during the breeding season and the data compiled for the Nest Recording Scheme as above. Pulli ringing of these boxes is not normally undertaken.
- Western Overshoot Compound (WOS). This is the fenced off area at the western end of the common on what was the gravel overshoot of the runway. The compound is divided into two and 18m mist nets are erected in each compartment. This area is mainly ringed during the spring and autumn migration.
- **Ground Nesting Birds Project.** The group also assists providing ringing capabilities, nest monitoring and schedule one facility as appropriate for the BBOWT coordinated ground nesting bird project on both Greenham & Crookham Commons for the period March to August.
- Other Areas. Occasional ringing took place in other areas of the common on a casual basis.

21 pulli ringed in the year, the recoveries are those birds that survived to be colour ringed (about seven days old) just one seen to fledge. The other two last seen at 616W thought to have been taken by foxes.

#### **Nest Recording**

In 2011 a nest monitoring group was set up, although initially there were eight volunteers it stabilised at five members. Pulli in nest boxes at Peckmore and Sandleford Copses are not normally ringed. 77 Nest were monitored with 65 Nest records submitted to the National Nest Record Scheme

The Peckmore Team (Steve Coulson, Martin Dear, Jon Brockbank) in 2011: located,

refurbished or replaced 17 old boxes in Peckmore Copse.

In the 2011 breeding season:

Blue Tit occupied 5 boxes, 37 young fledged

Great Tit occupied 4 boxes, 31 young fledged.

The Sandleford Team (Steve Ord, Katty Baird) in 2011 located, refurbished or replaced 17 old boxes in Sandleford Copse.

In the 2011 breeding season:

Blue Tit occupied 7 boxes, 67 young fledged Coal Tit occupied 1 box 8 young fledged. Nuthatch occupied 1 box 8 young fledged


Newbury Ringing Group since 2002 monitored 32 boxes in the Balshill Gully/Aldernbridge Gully Woodland, (Peaked Hill)

In the 2011 breeding season:

Blue Tit Great Tit occupied 14 boxes, 113 young fledged

occupied 8 boxes, 75 young fledged.

Below is a chart showing species occupation and young fledge between 2002 and 2011. 2011 is a relatively good year. Blue Tit Numbers are fairly stabile throughout the period and Great Tit numbers show a significant increase towards the end of the period.


